Multiple Marginalizations in the Glocal World



Dear members of En-Gender, dear undergraduate and graduate students, dear early career scholars,

En-Gender will have its third online conference this year taking place **9 – 11 August 2023**. This year's theme is multiple marginalizations in the glocal world. We want to engage with questions of indigenous and Black, queer and trans feminisms, forms of coloniality, intersectionality and power structures as well as how other forms of marginalizations, often dismissed within these discussions, relate to these and other experiences. We actively encourage submissions from different disciplines and historical periods. This conference is open for students and scholars of all levels to enhance the scholarly exchange around the globe.

We invite presentations on but not limited to the following topics:

- How do multiple marginalizations converge? Is the concept of intersectionality still applicable these days, especially on a global scale? Can we even compare different forms of marginalizations?
- How can we conceptualize bodily, psychological and cultural diversities, their experiences and their oppressions?
- What are similarities and differences between different forms of feminism, e.g. indigenous, Black and anti-/decolonial, queer and trans feminisms?
- How can a focus on specific marginalizations, e.g. from the lens of disability studies, inform the way we think about other marginalizations?
- How do hierarchies of oppression and power relate to each other and what role does gender, e.g. masculinity, play for structuring webs of power?
- How are various phobisms used by political instances to gain power and what role does the local and the global play here?
